When we begin to run dangerously low on our supply of coins, another batch will be ordered.


Centennial Commemorative?

The House's 100th anniversary year will be upon us, soon. Theta Sigma Tau was formally founded on May 2, 1910, and so the 100th anniversary of its founding is May 2, 2010 and the preceding 365 days comprise its 100th year of existence.

Would we like to do something to commemorate this occasion? One possibility would be a Centennial Coin or Medallion, similar to the challenge coin. Unlike the challenge coin, this would be a one-time release, dated. We could do a design like that on the challenge coin or perhaps something a bit different. Perhaps the obverse could have the house letters circled by "Theta Sigma Tau Centennial - 1910 - 2010. The reverse might have several small versions of the various crests from then till now.
